Hours are flexible, although all teachers are required to be online each weekday, Monday through Friday, and to hold regularly scheduled online office hours. **Some availability during MNOHS core hours (10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. M-F) is preferred.**

To better reflect the diversity of our student body, we especially encourage people of color and of all genders and abilities to apply.

Responsibilities:

- Complete Teaching Online, the MNOHS training course, with both synchronous and asynchronous components
- Engage with students, families, and faculty/staff in an interactive online environment (synchronous and asynchronous) to create a student-focused school community and culture

Qualifications:

- Pre-service teacher enrolled in approved teacher preparation program or Minnesota teacher's license in Health for grades 9-12
- Thorough knowledge of licensure field content, resources, pedagogy, and assessment
- Excellent communication, teaching, collaboration and strategic skills
- Experience using asynchronous and synchronous communication tools and productivity software in a professional setting (or comfort learning)
- Interest in online and alternative learning environments
- Commitment to educational equity and each student's success
- Computer with high-speed Internet access and a USB headset
- (Preferred) Experience collaborating with special education staff
- (Preferred) Experience as an online student or in online teaching
